It is the exception, and not the rule, for one physician's name to be spoken across the country with the same amount of recognition and reverence; Dr. Richard C. Staab was that physician.

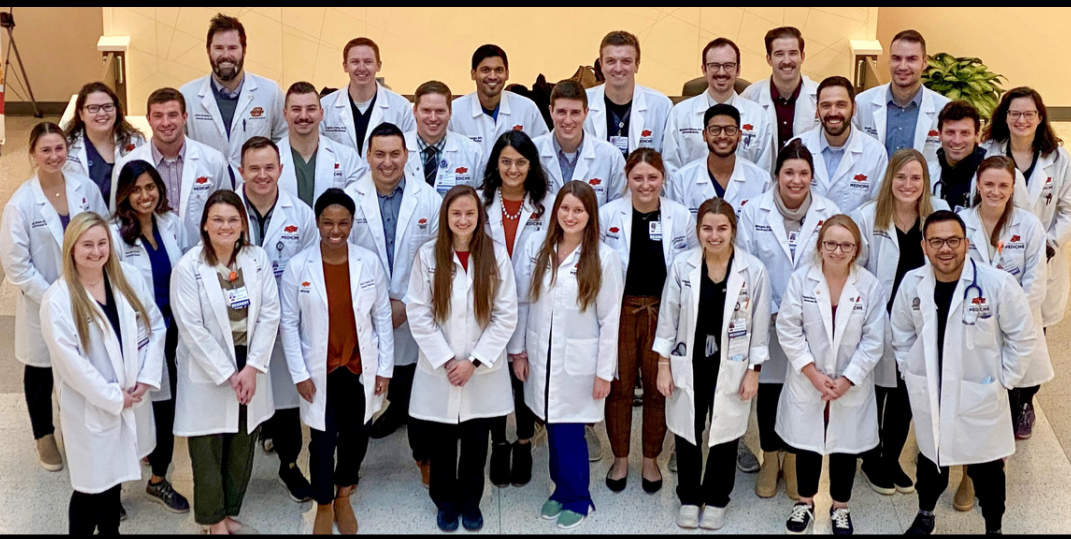

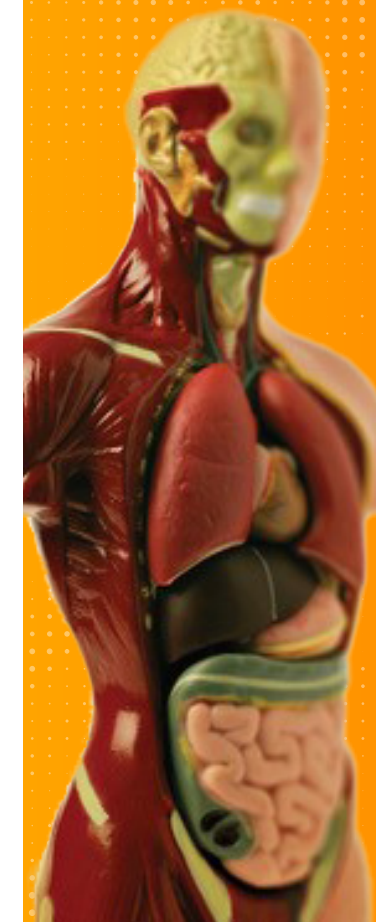
